



Sermon Study: *Heart 2 Heart*  
*John 17:6-19*  
June 19, 2022

**Lean In:** What is my experience/history/sentiment with the Lord's Prayer? What is the first thing I think about when I hear the Lord's Prayer?

**Look In:** Read **John 17:6-19** aloud together, and/or write out verse 11.

**Look Back:** What stood out to me most about this week's teaching? What questions do I have? What encouraged me? What challenged me? What comforted me?

**Take it Deeper:**

1. Make a list of all that can be learned about Jesus from this passage. What does Jesus's prayer reveal to me about his heart and what is important to him?
2. Read 1 Peter 5:8-9 and John 10:10. Have I ever considered that I have an enemy? What is his purpose? What is his strategy? How will this knowledge instruct my purpose and strategy in prayer?
3. What is my response to the idea that when Jesus prayed for protection, he wasn't praying for physical safety? How does that change the way I pray for my loved ones?
4. Read John 17:14-16. What does it mean to be "in the world but not of the world"? Where do I stand on the continuum of either isolating myself from the culture to imitating the culture? How can I remind myself I belong to a different Kingdom?
5. Of the things that Jesus asked God to give his disciples (protection from the enemy, fullness of joy, sanctification and unity), which of those do I feel I need the most right now? Which of these have I prayed for recently?
6. Read John 17:11-12. In Jesus's day, a person's name was synonymous with their character. What is it about Jesus's name and character that carries the power to protect? How does this comfort you?

**Look Up:** *Father, thank you for sending us Jesus, not just as a perfect role model, but as our Savior and friend. Thank you for the direct access we have to you through Jesus, and for the power to overcome because of the power of His great Name. Give us protection, joy, unity and sanctification as we are sent into the world for His glory.*
